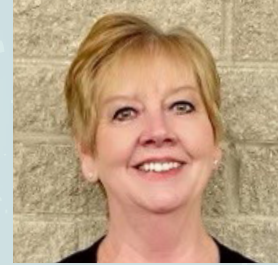

Welcome to our annual Holiday of Hope publication.

Each year, Hope House is honored to share reflections from our staff shaped by the resilience of individuals and families who are determined to **rise above homelessness, poverty, and hardship**. Their journeys toward self-sufficiency are made possible not only by our dedicated team, but by compassionate people, like you, who believe in the **strength of new beginnings**.

As the holidays draw near, I find myself reflecting on the **quiet miracles that happen every day**. Not just beneath twinkling lights or around festive tables, but in the halls of our Transitional Shelter and in the homes of those we serve. Every December, we celebrate the season of hope, but here at Hope House, that spirit lives year-round.

As we head into our 36th year, I am **filled with gratitude** for the lives we've touched, for the colleagues who give their all, and for the volunteers and donors who make our mission possible. Your generosity is the



thread that weaves hope into every story we're privileged to witness. Last year alone, our programs helped 360 community members transition from homelessness to stability. **Each number represents a life changed, a future reclaimed.**

I think of the mother who arrived, unsure of what tomorrow would bring. With the support of our team and the kindness of strangers, she found not just shelter, but a **renewed sense of purpose**. Today, she's thriving and so are her children.

I think of the man who came to us, burdened by fear and uncertainty. He didn't need much, just a little help to get back on his feet. Months later, he sent us a note: **You didn't just help me pay rent. You helped me find my way forward.**

You are part of every success, every smile, every step forward.

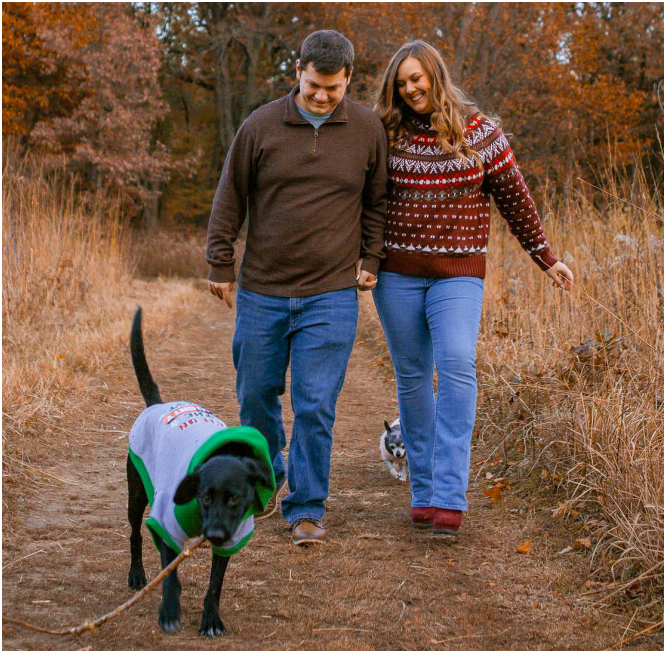
As we look ahead, I invite you to continue walking with us. **Your support is more than a gift; it is a lifeline.**

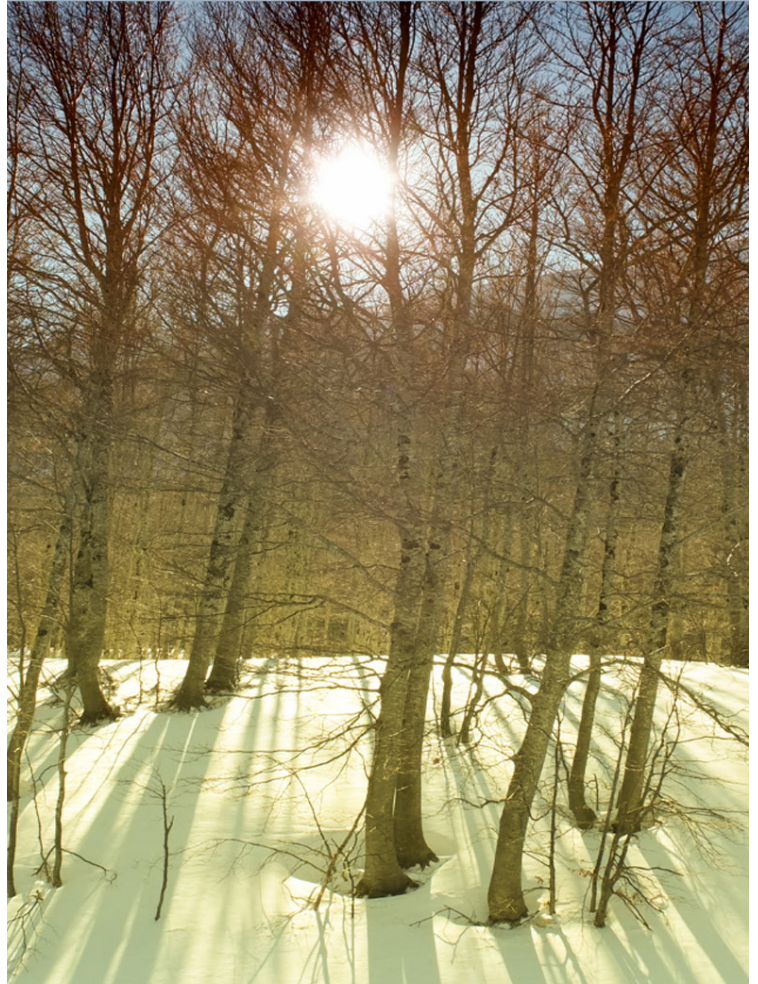

Always Time to Listen

I had a wonderful, elderly teacher in high school who used to say to the class when students were not paying attention to her, “**I know you’re hearing me, but are you listening?**” It was 1979 when there really was not much awareness of the value of human connection. My thought then was that it was such a curious question and what a perceptive person she must be. I had not yet learned about “active” listening, but it was one of those moments in life that I have never forgotten. It is something I have thought of a million times since.

At the time, I had no idea that most of my adult life would be spent in Social Services, but as it turns out, that one question asked by my teacher so many years ago has served me well in my various professional roles.

Later, I became aware of the importance of **making eye contact** with those who I am speaking to. I learned how important it is when interacting with a child to be at their eye level to ensure that they know that **I am listening, I am present, we are connected, and the words they are using** to express their thoughts and feelings **are valued**.

In the past, I have held positions for which spending too much time in conversation with clients was not well- received. That is not the case

in my current role, nor consequently, in life. At Hope House for the Homeless, **listening is valued and celebrated**. It is the first step in fulfilling our mission.



When people come to Hope House, they are **welcomed with kindness and absolutely no judgement** no matter what they happen to be going through. It may take a few extra minutes, but listening with empathy allows us to connect. It helps us identify their needs and how they align with our purpose. It shows that **our hearts and minds are open**. Giving voice to their stories shows that we feel compassion for their struggle. Sometimes, **just listening** allows them to exhale and to feel that **someone truly cares**.

There have been many times through the years when all I could offer was my presence, which often weighs heavily on me, but the countless occasions when someone has thanked me for just listening have been such a gift. That gratitude is a

kind of grace that heals my heart and motivates me to listen to the next person. And each time I am taken back to 1979, **I say a quiet thank you to my former teacher**.

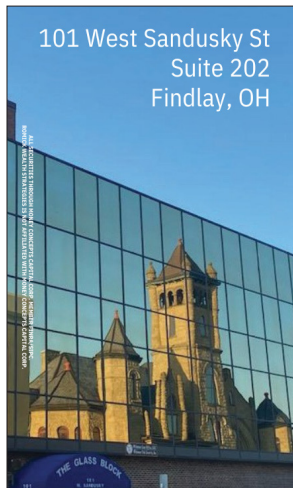

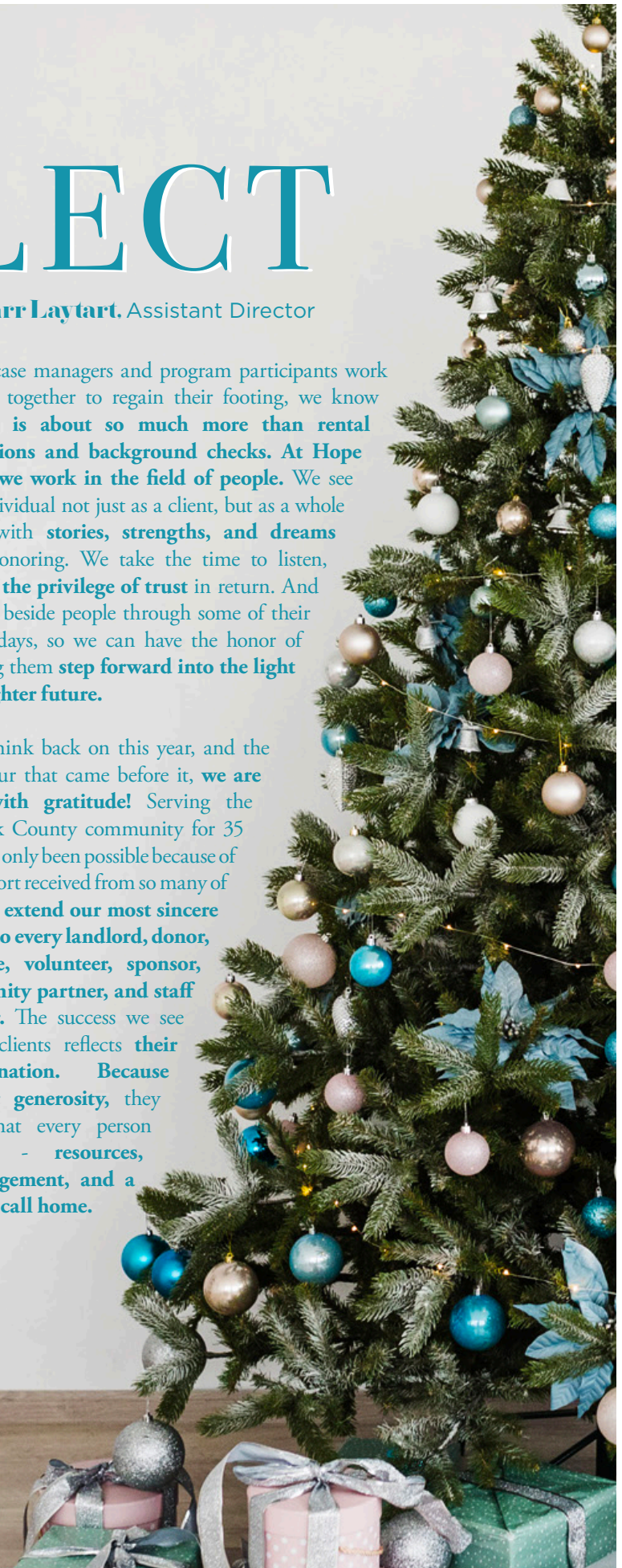
Over the years, we have seen the full spectrum of housing experiences, including moments of **hardship, resilience, and hope**. There have been many firsts within the walls of our transitional shelter as we watched **women become mothers, babies take their first steps, teenagers transition into adults, and adults step into their first apartments**, marking the beginning of their journey into independent living. We have also walked alongside clients in the Able Housing program through **moments of challenge and triumph** as they learn to navigate disabilities within their households and **lean into their strengths and skillsets**. And, we have witnessed those taking part in the Rapid Rehousing and Homelessness Prevention programs **gather information to make the right next decisions** in their journey to regain independence and stability.

We have listened as mamas read stories to toddlers nestled in their laps, finally **safe and warm** from the snow and cold they once trudged through in search of a place to rest. We have **stood side by side with a widower** as he lost the woman he loved, because he had no family to support him through the grief. We have **empowered a single father** with resources to help guide his teenage daughter in choosing a college, taking meaningful steps toward **breaking the cycle of generational poverty**.

While these things might not fit the traditional image of "housing," just think about all the everyday moments that take place in your home. I invite you to **reflect on the comfort and safety you feel** while wrapped in a blanket on your couch, surrounded by the warmth of your living room. Think of the confidence that grows from the **meaningful conversations** shared around your dining room table. Think back to the support you felt when **wrapped in the arms of someone you love**, standing together in the middle of your kitchen floor.

As our case managers and program participants work tirelessly together to regain their footing, we know **housing is about so much more than rental applications and background checks. At Hope House, we work in the field of people**. We see each individual not just as a client, but as a whole person with **stories, strengths, and dreams** worth honoring. We take the time to listen, **earning the privilege of trust** in return. And we walk beside people through some of their darkest days, so we can have the honor of watching them **step forward into the light of a brighter future**.

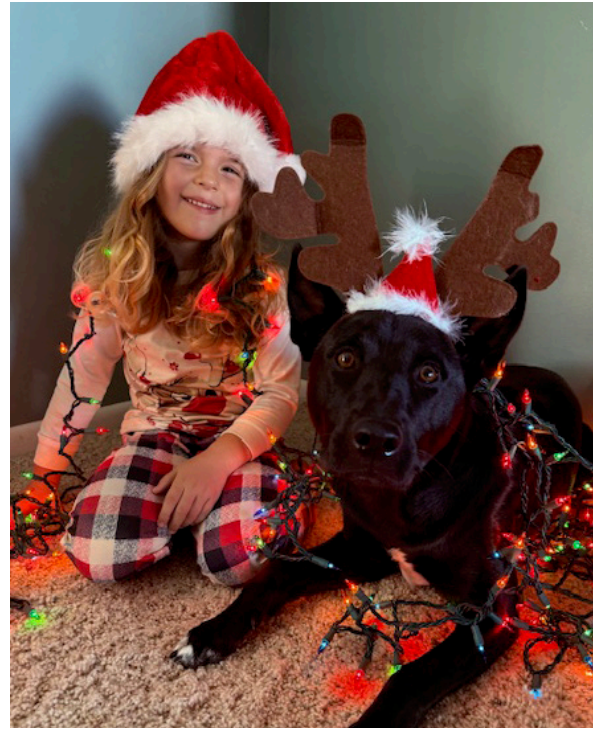

A TIME TO BELIEVE

This past year, our family has experienced several ups and downs. The hardest situation we faced was when we had to put our beloved dog to sleep. It was a time of sadness and grieving for the loss of an important member of our family. Later, we adopted a new puppy who was scared of everything! She didn't know what a treat was or a loving touch. She would hide when she could, and she wasn't able to let go and run because of the trauma of being left in a cage for the first three-and-a-half months of her life. We worked to show her **we believed in her and showed her what love truly feels like**. Now she is almost a year old, has expensive taste in shoes, loves cuddles, eats all the treats, and is so happy!

The process of caring for a new puppy reminds me of my position at Hope House. Many clients who come in have been in fight or flight mode for years. They forget what it is to have a roof over their head, not worry about where they will sleep each night, or know they will have food to eat tomorrow. As a Case Manager, I can **walk beside them** through the process of learning to remove themselves from a life of fight or flight. I show them **I believe in them** and give them the guidance they need to find a stable place to live once again. I can link them to resources to put food on the table. It's something that doesn't happen overnight. But when I see them work hard to get back on their feet, it's amazing how their demeanor changes. It is the most rewarding part of my job. **And watching them smile again is the best part.**

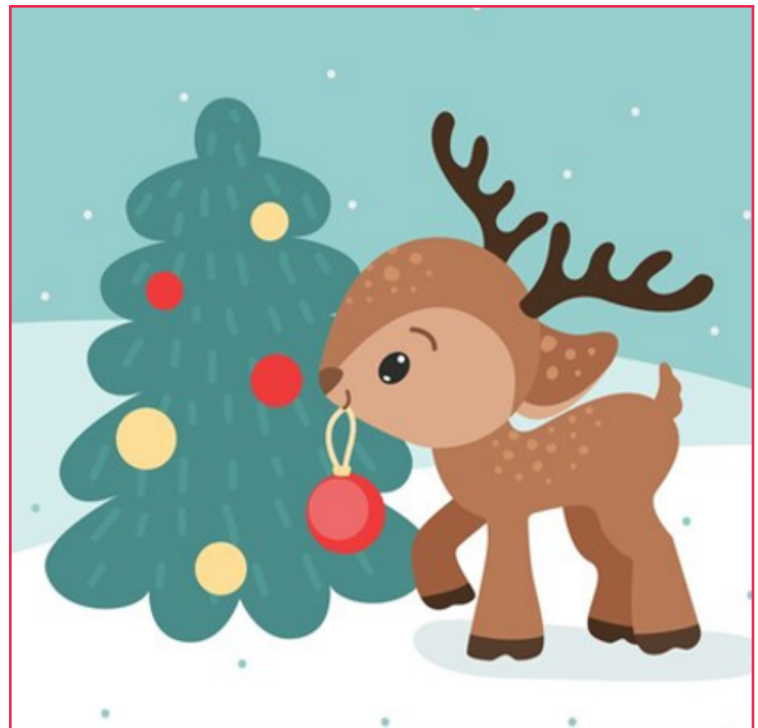

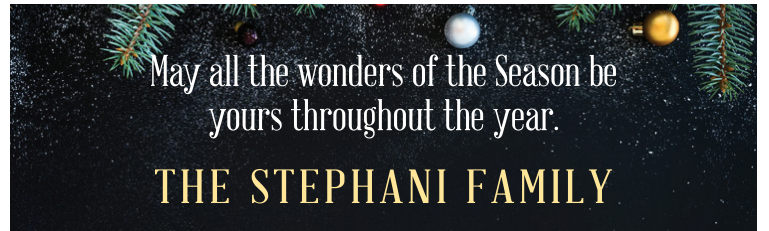
